Narratives

Disaster Damage:

The City of Minot, North Dakota, the county seat for Ward County, was inundated with flood waters on June 22, 2011. Concern about flooding began as early as January 2011, when Governor Jack Dalrymple declared a state emergency to provide flood protection in the Devils Lake Basin. By May 20th, President Obama had issued an emergency management declaration and two major disaster declarations for Public Assistance in North Dakota. All involved snow or water and all included Ward County and the City of Minot.

The eastern portion of Saskatchewan, Canada, like North Dakota, received above normal precipitation during the summer and fall of 2010, which left the ground saturated. This was followed by above normal snowfall in the winter of 2010-2011. Water levels were high throughout the Souris River Basin.

The Mouse River (as it is referred to in North Dakota), in the Minot area, started to rise in April 2011, and continued to rise throughout May. On May 23rd, emergency levee operations began and on May 31st the City ordered the first mandatory evacuation of thousands of people. The river crested approximately one foot lower than expected and residents were allowed to return to their homes. Subsequently, the river continued to rise.

On June 22nd, water began to overtop levees in Burlington and Minot, evacuation sirens were activated and mandatory evacuation orders were given for Burlington and Minot. At the Sherwood gauge, the first one south of the Canadian border, the Mouse River peaked at 29,700 cubic feet per second (cfs), surpassing the previous record of 14,800 cfs in 1976.

The geographic impacts included approximately 11,456 acres of land in Ward County inundated with anywhere between two and fifteen feet of water, impacting more than 4,800 structures throughout the valley. This includes the City of Minot, where the flood impacted the four mile area located in the center of town residing in the Mouse River Valley. This area was the oldest and most heavily developed portion of the City and included the downtown business district.

The damage to the City included 4,100 homes flooded with 3,100 lost or extensively damaged. There were 11,000 individuals displaced. Six public schools were severely damaged with two being completely lost. Twelve of 27 sanitary lift stations and all City water wells were inundated. This flood has left lasting damage to the City of Minot and its citizens including damage to eight river storm pump stations, 277 street lights, as well as many other vital components to infrastructure. An assessment completed by the Army Corps of Engineers states that "an estimated \$600 million of property and infrastructure damage" resulted from the flood. The City of Minot was declared eligible for federal assistance under FEMA 1981-DR.

Recovery Needs:

HOUSING

The City of Minot has extensive unmet needs for housing. Based on the most recent data, SBA has approved \$185,653,100 at an average of \$103,601 per loan. There are 857 loans yet to be approved. Using the average of \$103,601 per loan there is an estimated \$88,786,057 in unmet needs. This corresponds to the FEMA/SBA/HUD formula which identifies an estimate of \$49,885,535.22 in unmet needs for major and severe damages. Based on the current data, the minimum unmet need for housing is at least \$49,885,535.22 and as high as \$88,786,057. The projected housing impact combines the \$185,653,100 that SBA has approved in loans plus \$88,786,057 in remaining unmet needs for a total of \$274,439,157. As of the writing of the



Action Plan, FEMA reported that a total of 1,478 households were still in FEMA temporary housing units. Of these, 1,086 are homeowner households and 392 are renter households. It has become almost impossible for renter households to find available rental units as the City of Minot has a less than 1% vacancy rate. When a rental unit does become available the costs are almost triple the pre-flood rate and outside the means for low-and-moderate income households.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Impacts to infrastructure resulted in 2,923 FEMA project worksheets obligated for the DR-1981-ND FEMA disaster. Obligated public assistance funds equal \$173,207,650. Infrastructure and public facility damage estimates totaled approximately \$368,187,378. After FEMA assistance, approximately \$178,977,378 remained in unmet needs. The following list of flood damages was reported by the City of Minot, Minot Public Schools, and the Minot Park District to the State of North Dakota Legislators in the fall of 2011:

- 6 Minot Public Schools severely damaged to include the complete loss of 2 schools
- 51 Park buildings damaged
- 5 baseball fields damaged
- 29 zoo buildings damaged, causing the zoo to close
- Roosevelt pool and bathhouse lost
- Oak Park splash pad and mechanical building lost
- 9 playgrounds damaged
- 12 churches damaged
- 20 plus water system breaks
- 12 of 27 sanitary lift stations inundated with water
- 13 (all) water wells inundated with water
- 8 river pump stations damaged
- 30 to 40 sink holes from ground water
- 3 pedestrian bridges damaged
- 2 highway/street bridges damaged
- 277 street lights damaged
- 16 electrical feed points damaged
- 10 traffic lights damaged
- 1,000 traffic signs were damaged
- 51 miles of roads, sewer and water lines were damaged
- 33 miles of storm sewers damaged

ECONOMIC

Businesses located along the Mouse River were significantly impacted by flood waters directly through property loss and interruption of daily operations. These losses had an immediate impact on the lives of residents, the operations of the City of Minot, and the future healthy economic development of the region. Recovery from the flood event of 2011 is critical for the businesses of the City of Minot. Strong employment, continuous services and business growth will result if steps are taken to assist in the recovery of the business sector. A survey

Recovery Needs:

Businesses showed the most pressing current needs identified by the impacted businesses in Minot (in order of importance) are construction, manufacturing, wholesale, restaurant/bar, hotel/motel, transportation, and retail workers. It appears from the report their major concern was "appropriate staffing" and housing for employees. Businesses that have rebuilt cannot find available housing for their employees. It is estimated approximately \$52,498,621 remains in unmet needs.

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #1

The City will be deleting one of its original proposed projects identified in the approved Action Plan: "3rd Street Sewer System Improvements". The project is being removed due to time sensitive issues which will not allow the projects to move forward using CDBG disaster recovery funding. The City deleted the 3rd Street Sewer System Improvements and transferred the funds to the Master Lift Station.

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #2

The City will be deleting two of its original proposed activities, and reducing funds for a third activity identified in the approved Action Plan. The reduced funds will be used to create a new activity. The "Downtown Infrastructure" project is being removed as this will now be funded through other sources. The CDBG-DR funds are being appropriated to assist the parking garages which support the Imagine Minot Affordable Rental Project. The Voluntary Acquisition of Flood Properties Project will have funds reallocated to a new and separate Demolition of Flooded Properties. This new activity will address the need to clear properties purchased under the Voluntary Acquisition of Flooded Properties Program.

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #3

The City is changing the "Imagine Minot" parking facility project from a Low to Moderate Income housing related national objective to a public facility Urgent Need for economic revitalization national objective. In addition, the City is deleting one of its original proposed projects identified in the approved Action Plan as Southeast Tax Credit Rental Units Infrastructure. The project is being removed due to time sensitive issues which will not allow the project to move forward using CDBG disaster recovery funding. The funds from this project will be transferred to address additional costs associated with the Domestic Violence Center Infrastructure project. Itemized project delivery amounts were added to each activity.



ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #4

The City is satisfying two objectives. The first is to change the amount of the monetary cap placed on home rehabilitation and home reconstruction. The second objective is to change the name of the "Northern Housing Development Infrastructure" to reflect the current proposed location: "55th Street Crossing Affordable Housing Development".

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #5

The City is changing the Master and Control Lift station public facility activity from an Urgent Need related national objective to a public facility Low Moderate Income Area national objective. In addition, the City is changing the Northern Sewer public facility activity from a Low to Moderate Income Area ntoaloj

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #6

The City is deleting the activity of "Acquisition of Vacant or Abandoned Lots for Affordable Housing" which was budgeted at \$8,504,225.56 in favor of a solution which will benefit many more rental candidates. The City proposes to provide funds to assist in the development of Affordable Rental Housing. The City is working with the Minot Housing Authority (Public Housing) and a non-profit to provide Affordable Senior Apartments (\$1,326,000) and a Mixed-Use Rental Development (\$935,000) leveraging low-income tax credits and State tax incentives. Both of these projects will benefit 100% low-to moderate income. In addition, the City proposes to use \$6,242,625.56 for the rehabilitation or reconstruction of small rental units (1-4 units) damaged by the 2011 flood. The units are required to be leased to persons of low to moderate income for a minimum of five years.

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #7

The City is in the process of closing out the Housing Rehabilitation/Reconstruction Program for low to moderate households. The program was open for over a year to ensure all low to moderate income homeowners who had flood damaged homes with unmet needs had the opportunity to apply for assistance. Approximately, \$2,439,746.77 will be left in this activity. Other approved activities have been completed such as road access for the Domestic Violence Center (\$195,194.54), the Affordable Housing Strategy Planning Study (\$123,822.50), Unmet Needs Assessment (\$29,285), Acquisition (\$1,541,178.25), Relocation (\$10,609.49) and Demolition (\$1,293,577.16) of the structures on the properties acquired by the City. Monies left in these activities are proposed to be reallocated to the activities listed below. In addition, applications for the Small Rental Rehabilitation/Reconstruction have been received. There are fewer applications than the City anticipated; therefore, \$545,138.52 is being proposed to be moved into other needed activities. Last, the Emergency Disaster Plan (\$150,000) is being removed from the Planning activity since it was found the study was not needed at this time. Minot budget changes are being made to project delivery for the various activities.

The City proposes to move these monies into the following activities:

1. "Reimbursement for Demolition of Flooded Properties" - Because of health and safety threats caused by the flood, the City paid the costs to demolish 20 homes. The City wants to reimburse itself for the cost of these demolitions so the owners of these homes will not be assessed for these costs. These homes were not located in a flood zone and most homeowners did not have flood insurance. In order for the residents of these homes to rebuild, it is critical the demolition costs not become an additional burden to their already stretched resources (\$355,684.90).
2. "Downtown Sewer and Water Improvements" - Water and sewer improvements in Downtown Minot, which serve a low to moderate income area (\$5,000,000).
3. "Cook's Court Affordable Senior Apartments" - Additional monies were needed due to unsuitable fill material being placed on the property by a former owner. While increasing the overall amount for the pro

Public Comment:

The City received 68 official comments on the proposed 2012 CDBG Disaster Recovery Action Plan during the public comment period. Comments were received by e-mail during the official comment period of June 26, 2012 through July 3, 2012. The Proposed 2012 CDBG Disaster Recovery Action Plan was posted on the City's websites. The Public Hearing was held on June 28, 2012, at City Hall. Approximately 77 people attended the hearing and the transcript from the hearing, as well as all received comments, are included in the Action Plan.

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #8

Class III Studies are being required by the State Historical Preservation Office (SHPO) on properties being demolished under the Buyout program. Therefore, \$24,000 is being moved into the demolition activity and the administration activity is being reduced by \$24,000. The Small Rental Program is being reduced by \$50,000 and those funds are being moved into the Demolition project delivery. In addition, under the Small Rental Rehabilitation and Reconstruction program, there are some tenants occupying units. Therefore, \$175,000 will be moved from the Small Rental Program into the Relocation activity. Another minor adjustment was made adding money to the completed Acquisition and Demolition activities out of the Small Rental Program for final costs.

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #9

The City is moving \$1,328,592.43 from the Small Rental Program in order to make the following changes:

- \$100,000 to planning for a Flood Preparedness Plan
- \$620,000 for housing rehabilitation
- \$610,000 for housing reconstruction
- Minor budget changes are being made to project delivery costs for the various activities.

The Small Rental Program did not attract as many applicants as originally estimated, which allows for the reallocation of the funds to the rehabilitation and reconstruction programs.

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #10

The City is moving \$3,198,495 from activities finished or nearly finished and reprogramming those monies into the following activities:

- \$115,000 to a new affordable housing project
- \$2,833,495 for the voluntary and involuntary acquisition of additional properties in the flood inundation area
- \$250,000 for down payment assistance for homeowners
- Minor budget changes are being made to project delivery costs for the various activities.

By reprogramming these funds the City will be able to provide an additional 74 affordable rental housing units for its low-to-moderate-income (LMI) residents, provide homeownership assistance to 10 LMI buyers, and remove additional households out of harm's way.

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #11

The City is moving monies into activities for final payments on various activities to include Roosevelt, Walders, Airport and 13th Street lift stations, home rehabilitation and Sunset Ridge Affordable Housing project. The monies are being moved from the acquisition activity, demolition of unsafe structures, and reconstruction of flooded properties into these activities.

ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT #12

As more projects are nearing completion, the City is adjusting activity budgets to accommodate underruns and overruns.

Overall Progress Narrative:

Progress for the quarter was made in all program areas. The Public Infrastructure Program continues to make headway, with the final payment made on the Northern Sewer Project and final arrangements are being made for the purchase of additional land for the Landfill Expansion Project. The Homeowner Housing Program is progressing with some revisions slated for the Down Payment Assistance Program. The Rental Housing Program is making progress, as Sunset Ridge Workforce Housing Project leased seven (7) units. The Economic Development Projects are making headway with the Imagine Minot Downtown Development Parking Facility's Central Parking Ramp completed, however, construction of the apartments above the structures has not started; Phase II of the Downtown Sewer and Water Improvements Project is 90-percent complete and Phase III is 45-percent complete. Overall, the Disaster Recovery Program is maintaining compliance with the performance metrics established in the Performance Schedule outlined on pages 65-69 of the Action Plan.

The internal auditors concluded the CDBG-DR quarterly website monitoring review with the report written May 12, 2017. The Section 504 compliance review was completed with the report written May 2, 2017.



The Home Rehabilitation & Reconstruction review was completed and report written on June 5, 2017. Initiated this quarter is the Small Rental, Rehabilitation, & Reconstruction review, the Conflict of Interest Policy, the Relocation Assistance & Down Payment Assistance for Displaced Tenants, and Imagine Minot Downtown Development Parking Facilities. Internal auditors continue to provide technical assistance as issues arise.

Activity Description:

Direct impact from flood debris has exceeded landfill capacity. According to the Director of Public Works, pre-flood inert waste averaged about 20,000 tons per year. In 2011, inert waste totaled 120,000 tons. Municipal solid waste averaged 60,000 tons per year for 2009 and 2010. In 2011, this jumped by 20 percent to 72,000 tons. A new cell will be added to the existing landfill operation. Initially this cell will operate concurrent with the other landfill cells until they are phased out. The expansion of the landfill ensures the city landfill will have the capacity to continue to receive debris from the flooded area as homes are demolished. This will ensure there are no hazardous or unsafe issues in neighborhoods recovering from the flood.

Due to the anticipated relocation of residents from the valley to the north hill area, infrastructure improvements must be made to provide for the population shifts. The current flow of sewage from the north hill area flows into the valley and during the flood event caused more stress on the Valley Force Main. The primary cause for this deficiency is the capacity of the existing pump station and force main, located on the north side of the 6th Street Underpass adjacent to 2nd Avenue Southwest. The pump station and associated 12-inch force main have a capacity of approximately 1,600 gallons per minute (gpm). This location has experienced flows of approximately 70,000 gpm.

Phase II construction is about 90% complete with contractor working on punch list items. Phase III construction is about 45% complete: Utility work is ahead of schedule, but paving has fallen behind.
